The staff and physicians consistently provide the finest in diagnostic services, as well as surgical and non-surgical treatments. Each physician is board certified and has years of experience in the medical and surgical treatment of orthopedic injuries or disorders.

Prior to moving to Bakersfield, Dr. Wahba obtained his undergraduate degree at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) and graduated Summa Cum Laude with College Honors. He then graduated at the top of his class from the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) School of Medicine, which is consistently ranked as one of the top medical schools in the country. After medical school, he completed a five-year residency in orthopedic surgery at the University of California, Irvine (UCI) before completing a prestigious fellowship in spine surgery from Harvard Medical

School. During that time, he trained at Massachusetts General Hospital and Brigham & Women's Hospital in Boston, two of the most renowned medical centers in the world.

Along with the opportunity to work alongside some of the most respected orthopedic surgeons in the community, Dr. Wahba was also drawn to Bakersfield thanks to the advanced surgical facilities available at Mercy.

The addition of a spine surgeon with Dr. Wahba's extraordinary background and training further enhances the services at the Orthopedic & Hand Center. Along with comprehensive spine services, the Center also offers joint replacement and construction, foot and ankle repair, hand and wrist surgery, shoulder and elbow repair, and diagnosis and treatment of sports injuries.

Thanks to Dr. Wahba's high levels of training and the advanced technology available at Mercy, he can perform minimally invasive surgical techniques whenever possible. This allows surgeons to accomplish the same goal of traditional "open" surgeries with smaller incisions and less disruption to the muscle and surrounding soft tissue. The end result is usually a shorter hospital stay, decreased post-operative pain, lower blood loss, and a faster recovery time.

Having access to these sub-specialty orthopedic surgeons under one roof is also major benefit to orthopedic patients throughout Kern County, Wahba said.

"It is a very tight-knit relationship and I think it's great for patients because it definitely helps increase access to high quality orthopedic care. Here, you have a strong collection of very well trained, highly specialized surgeons who are all in one place and can collaborate with each other."

With the surgeons, staff and facilities available at Mercy's Orthopedic & Hand Center, Dr. Wahba believes there is no reason for Kern County's orthopedic patients to seek services elsewhere.
